2010 NEBBIOLO, PASO ROBLES

The Harrington Nebbiolo is sourced from two Westside Paso Robles vineyards. The Luna Matta Vineyard is a higher elevation (1750 ft) ridgetop vineyard with calcareous soil and sand. The Berardo Vineyard is located in the famed Templeton Gap appellation and is also a south-facing hillside planted in fractured calcareous slate soils. These soils bear a striking resemblance to the soils of the Langhe. The Berardo vineyard is planted to the Lampia Nebbiolo clone, which adds deep red color, dense aromatics, dark fruit flavors and a rich base. Luna Matta, situated farther west at a higher altitude, provides the 142 and 230 clones, adding bright floral aromatics, red fruits and powdery tannins to the final blend.
